Your invitation to bid stipulated that this cloth was to Federal
Specification SS-C-466A, type 1, grade A, class 5. This specifi-
cation has now been superseded by the Interim specification
mentioned above, copy of which you will find attached. Notice that
on the first page, in the middle of the specification, you will
find that Form 1, Grade UG, Style 5 shown and on page 4 of this
specification, under table 4, you will see that there are listed
two different constructions of cloth averaging 1.10 lbs. per square
yard and one construction of cloth averaging 1.40 lbs. per square
yard. Our AG-110 conforms to the first construction shown which
we have marked in red pencil for you.
