1. Sample Storage Policy.

(Kos to SAC Nov. 1, 1982)

SAC reviewed policy statement proposed by SHAC on this subject for the Guide to Accident Prevention booklet. SAC supports the basic concept and proposes we remove the word sample, to extend the policy to materials such as flammable die-penetrant aerosol cans, etc., that may present a serious hazard, but not be viewed as "samples." The policy should apply to all hazardous materials.

2. Extension Ladder Ring Securement.

(Kos to SAC Nov. 2, 1982)

We support the method proposed by SHAC.

3. Manlift Rules.

(Riddle to SAC October 4, 1982)

We support the team's (Riddle, Glass, H. Jackson) recommended procedures.

4. Safety Showering.

SAC approved proposed policy statement with minor revisions. The statement will be included in the Guide to Accident Prevention.

Purchase of wraparound robes for distribution to areas and labs will begin shortly.

Training aids with plantwide applicability will also be developed by Glass/Steele.

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5. 1982 S&PP Survey Recommendations.

82-2: Emergency Shutdown/Standby Procedures

Superintendents (Manufacturing, Lab, Cafeteria, etc.) to survey their areas to determine

- a) what procedures are available
- b) what degree of preparation exists particularly at the chief level
- c) what needs exist to develop formal procedures

SAC recommends report/discussion at January PMSB meeting.

82-4: Metal Hardhats

SAC supports the recommendation of S&PP to phase out metal hats, even for crafts and groups where metal hats do not represent an obvious, recognized hazard.

Metal hats are not any longer carried in Safety Supplies. We propose that the PMSB members encourage those in their organizations that still use metal hats to replace them.

82-6: Tank Valve Blind Flanges

SAC supports the recommendation as written, applicable to

- a) tank bottom valves
- b) where a leak or valve failure could cause a hazardous condition or serious environmental exposure.

Tank owners should survey their areas and report compliance/exceptions to PMSB in December.
