B. F. Penrose Interview Report

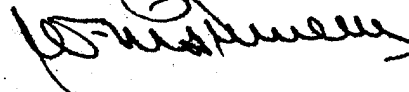

I have received copy of Ben Penrose' Interview Report of March 25th, covering his talk with Henry Betail, Operations Manager of Imperial Oil Limited, Vancouver, B. C., regarding the Canadian regulations requiring lead warning signs on pumps dispensing lead-treated gasoline.

I do not think we should write to Mr. Betail as information of this kind in writing should emanate from their head office in Toronto. This same subject was covered in writing to Imperial Oil Limited on March 8, 1946 and I am sending you herewith two copies of that letter together with copies of letter we wrote to the Service Station Equipment Company, Ltd., Toronto, Canada.
