Dear Mr. Perkins:

I have received from Mr. O. B. Lewis your request for information in the case of Mr. [REDACTED], an employee of Texas Company.

I have corresponded with Dr. Leland L. Brown of Mobile, Alabama who gave me very complete information. I feel that aside from the remote possibility of mild chronic gasoline intoxication, there is little likelihood of other occupational exposure which could be responsible for Mr. [REDACTED] present illness.

If laboratory conditions permit undue gasoline vapor exposure, these should be corrected by more adequate ventilation including exhaust vents over the work tables. Aside from this I have no other suggestion.

Dr. Brown states that Mr. [REDACTED] is greatly improved and no doubt will soon be able to resume his duties.
