Dear Bob:

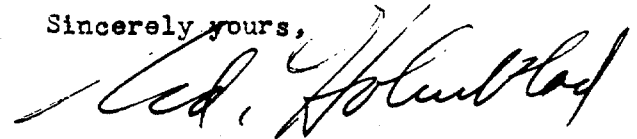
