Dear Doctor Sale:

I am reporting to you herewith the result of our analysis of a sample of urine on [REDACTED] submitted by you and received by us on April 12th, 1941.

The result obtained is within the limits for normal individuals free of abnormal lead exposure. (Samples of this size obtained on normal individuals vary between 0.01 and 0.10 milligrams per liter, whereas samples obtained over a period of twenty-four hours or more, usually vary within the limits of 0.02 and 0.08 milligrams per liter.)

Unfortunately the sample of blood could not be analyzed since the tube was broken in transit, and the blood had escaped. I did not report this to you immediately, nor did I send you another tube and a needle since I realized that Mr. [REDACTED] might not be under your care for any prolonged period of time, and a further sample might be difficult to obtain. There would be a certain advantage in obtaining another sample of blood, but I shall await word from you before sending the necessary container. It is unfortunate that the sample was not packed with sufficient care against breakage.
