The committee also recommended that the same paints be placed on test at the Sub-Tropical Testing Station, Miami, Fla. and Mr. Zimmermann agreed to make up the test panels and forward them on to the Miami, Fla. test site. that the same paints be placed on test at the Sub-Tropical Testing Station, Miami, Fla. agreed to supply paint samples to Mr. Zimmermann at New Orleans, but no action was taken.

REMARKS BY SECRETARY

The secretary reported that he was unable to compare, from the data available to him, the Red Lead Technical Letter recommendations with the latest inspection report of this project, which was requested of him by the Committee at its last meeting.

The committee recommended that the secretary confer with Messrs. Bates and Zimmerman on this point and report to the committee at its next meeting.

L.I.A. PROJECT 22

The inspection report of the test panels in Project 22, prepared by C. A. Lominska, Exhibit "A" attached (sent to committee December 21, 1956) was then discussed.

It was the opinion of the committee that the test be continued.

CALCIUM PLUMBATE AND "BLAKLED" PAINTS
IN L.I.A. PROJECT 23

The chairman raised the question as to the advisability of including calcium plumbate formulations and "Blakled" paints in L.I.A. Project 23.

It was the opinion of the committee that calcium plumbate formulations not be included in L.I.A. Project 23. However, the committee did feel that some tests should be made on this pigment and that a definite program be worked out at the next meeting.

It was suggested that if a test program is conducted, a red lead paint, competitive in cost, be included.

The secretary reported that a 50 lb. drum of calcium plumbate was being sent the committee by England's Lead Industries Development Council.

As for the "Blakled" paints, the committee reported that it had been unsuccessful in securing samples of this paint and any action was deferred until such time as samples are available.
