Dear Ray:

Before you receive this letter you will have received a number of copies of the new placard for posting at mixing plants in English speaking countries. You will also have received copies of the small booklet for mixing operations employing liter cans. On thinking over the situation with regard to the omission of Paragraph 8 from the white booklet, it seems wise to me to take the necessary trouble to add this rule which was missed through some oversight. Accordingly I would suggest that you have enough little slips printed to paste into such of these booklets as you have in your possession. I have suggested to Mr. Schaefer who has had the printing done, that he do the same thing, thereby taking care of all of those which will go out in the future. The paragraph 8 should read as follows:

8. When an inside can has been opened, its entire contents must be mixed with the proper quantity of gasoline and the can must be destroyed. Cans must not be emptied partially and then stored.

With regard to the placards, the new ones in English should be substituted for the old ones as rapidly as it is convenient to do so.

You will receive the foreign translations of these in short order and these should be handled in the same fashion which I described in my previous letter with relation to the new regulation booklets. They are much better in their present form than the ones which are now in use, and they should be substituted for those now in use as rapidly as it is convenient. However, if you will have them carefully checked for me and return a copy of the French, German, and Italian translations with such corrections as are made by Thenault and others whom you may select to do the checking, I will have any changes

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which seem necessary made as promptly as possible. I will take into account any detailed criticisms in addition to those which you have made which arise from the actual practical use of them. I hope to get this all cleaned up and in such a manner that it will not be necessary to revamp any of these instructions for a long period of time.
