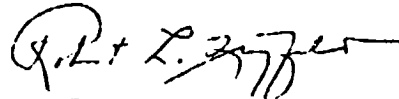
To Secondary Lead Producing Members of the

The Executive Vice President stated that this group was meeting at the suggestion of several members to determine how and in what areas the Association could best serve the interests of the secondary lead producing members.

Air Pollution Regulation

The group felt that a major problem was the lack of uniformity in air pollution regulations.

It was agreed that if the Association could aid in the acceptance of uniform regulations that would be acceptable to local regulatory bodies it would be highly beneficial to the industry.

Disposal of Battery Boxes

Another problem area is the disposal of battery boxes. The discussion centered on present disposal methods which are costly in most areas of the country. It was suggested that perhaps a research effort to determine possible uses for old battery boxes could be initiated.

Formation of Committee or Division

After some discussion the group requested the Executive Vice President to investigate the possibilities of forming a permanent committee or Division of the Association representative of secondary lead producers.

It was suggested and the group approved the election of Mr. Virgil Murph as pro tem chairman subject to the approval by the Board of the Committee and the Chairman.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 A.M.
