37.3 average of April 1959. Three days in the 80s were noted, topped by 87 on the 15th day. (Highest April reading on record is 91 degrees, registered in 1923.) Renard's rain gauge collected only .27 inches of precipitation during the month, compared with an average of 1.31 inches. It was the fourth consecutive month of below average rainfall, a factor that

There were 13 days with varying degrees of fog, the bulk of them in the first half of the month. If you go by the odds, Renard said, this month stands a fairly good chance of being cooler than last month. He noted that the normal incidence of fog keeps the average temperature in May to 55.8 degrees, a full degree more than the average for last month.

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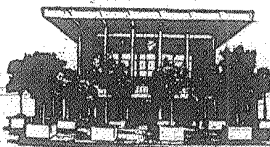
