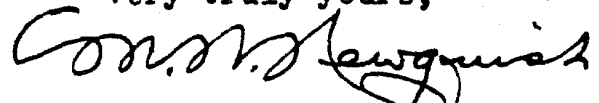
Dear Doctor Kehoe:

Dinner will be served followed by our meeting. I believe that Doctor Holmblad or Doctor Slobe have already invited you to attend this meeting; if not, you are hereby extended a most hearty invitation.

Doctor Slobe has kindly forwarded to me your letter to him of August 21st concerning certain objectives to be achieved.
