

company of Cleveland, who left the organization to become a general manager of the Bond Great West Clothing Company of Los Angeles. Told members of the Chamber of Commerce at their regular weekly meeting last week that preliminary arrangements for the factory plotted.

The Bond Company will erect a modern plant in Los Angeles with an ultimate capacity of about 600,000 men's and boys' suits and overcoats annually, according to Mr. Workman. "This full capacity cannot be reached short of two or three years," Mr. Workman told the chamber members. A great retail store will be opened at the factory here first and from this, distributing stores will be opened rapidly until all the important towns west of the Continental Divide and reaching into Texas will be covered.

"We will open with a capacity of about 10,000 suits a month and increase the output as the distribution is arranged until we reach about 50,000 suits a month. When running at full capacity we will consume approximately 2,000,000 yards of fabric annually."

Mr. Workman said that arrangements would probably be made to obtain all or a large part of the fabrics used in manufacturing the garments from Los Angeles woolen mills.

CUBAN MARKET DULL

Expectations of actual business in textile goods with the opening of the sugar-grinding season have not materialized, and various dealers report less favorable business than for the same period a year ago, says Commercial Attache C. H. Cunningham. Some houses have experienced difficulty in making collections from the interior and there has been a resultant tendency to restrict the acceptance of orders. A number of textile salesmen from European houses, notably German and Italian, have visited Cuba in recent months, and competition from Germany, Switzerland and France, in the sale of artificial silk and ribbons has been reported.

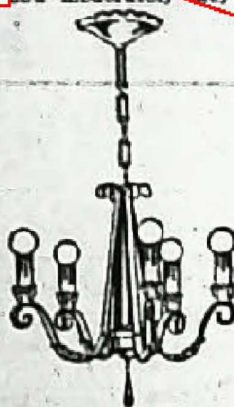
AUSTRALIA WOOL AUCTIONS

The fifth wool auction sales of the present season took place in Adelaide on February 1, when 23,881 bales were sold. The bidding was keen and the prices generally ranged about 10 to 12 1/2 per cent higher than those obtained at the December sales. The highest price paid was 21 1/2 pence per pound for thirty-two bales of greasy wethers. The next highest price was 21 3/4 pence per pound for

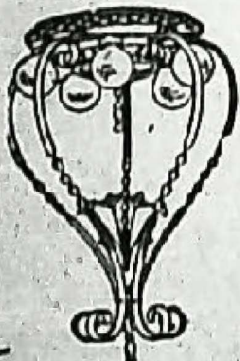
