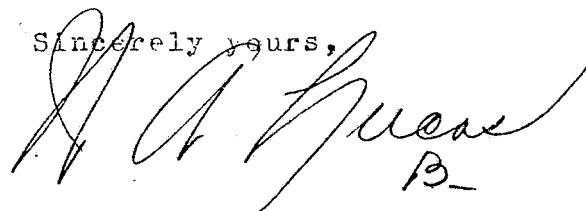
I still marvel at your ability to translate highly technical evidence into so simple language that even lawyers and jurors understood what you were saying.
