Gentlemen:

The course that [REDACTED] ran was practically the same as in the case of [REDACTED], with the exception that Mr. [REDACTED] had a period of mild excitation which lasted three days. This necessitated confining him in a private room at the New Britain General Hospital with a day and night special nurse for the above mentioned period. He is still hospitalized but in a compensation ward and I expect to discharge him on September 30th. It will probably be two weeks before I will allow him to return to his work. I might add that his case was a little more severe than Bonini's. He is complaining of tinnitus (ringing of the ears). I do not believe this sequella will be permanent.
