

1 selling it basically as the distributor.

2 And then things went so well that from 1958
3 into the 1970s, Owens-Corning Fiberglas decides not
4 only are they going to sell it, but they buy the line
5 from Owens-Illinois and they make it.

6 That is why we are here, ladies and
7 gentlemen.

8 There will be no dispute about what is on
9 this board, no dispute. I dare say that the lawyers
10 will get up and admit this. They will admit this that
11 Kaylo was a form of pipecovering and block, that it
12 was made by Owens-Illinois during a period of time,
13 made by and distributed by Owens-Corning Fiberglas.

14 There will be no dispute about that.

15 Ladies and gentlemen, also a thing that
16 there will be no dispute about is that the Kaylo had
17 asbestos in it. That is from '43 to '58 when Owens-
18 Illinois is making the asbestos-containing
19 pipecovering, it has got 13 to 25 percent amosite and
20 chrysotile asbestos in it. Mr. Ignatowski told you a
21 little bit about those differences.
