

PROVISIONS FOR RAPID MOVEMENT OF VESSELS
THREATENED BY FIRE OR OTHER HAZARDOUS CONDITIONS

- A. It is a company regulation that all barges, while made up to Conoco's docks, in any capacity, must, at all times, have an operable tug standing by.
- B. It is a company regulation that all ships, while made up to Conoco's docks, in any capacity, must be operable at all times.
 - 1. In case of emergency there are two tug companies that maintain docking tugs in the area.
 - (a) Harbor Docking and Towing Company

A minimum of two tugs are berthed at this location which is approximately 30-45 minutes from Conoco's facilities.
 - (b) Sabine Towing and Transportation Company, Inc.

A minimum of two tugs are berthed at this location which is 10-15 minutes from Conoco's facilities.
- C. Vessels will be moved from Conoco's facilities during any emergency that might be hazardous to the safety of all personnel at that facility, and/or hazardous to the vessel at that facility. Decision to move a vessel will be made by one of the following people:
