Dr. Lanza tells me this morning that he finally, after several days of difficulty in getting in touch with him, has been in touch with Dr. Lynch of South Carolina by phone. Lynch tells Lanza that Dr. Gardner's Saranac data which he, Lynch, was working on is now in good shape and will be in Lanza's hands within a week.

Therefore, Lanza expects to have these data back by the end of July. Inasmuch as he doesn't know what the data will show, or how good a job has been done in putting it together, it is difficult to say just when it can be considered in final form. Also, inasmuch as Dr. Gardner's conclusions are not yet known, information will have to be looked over to see whether his conclusions are such that will be helpful to us in our problems.

Upon receiving and going over the information and seeing what is in it, Dr. Lanza will check with us as to what is to be done next so as to make the best possible use of the material in the shortest possible time.
