I am afraid that I am unable to reply intelligently to the question in your letter of November 13th. Illness from exposure to carbon tetrachloride is somewhat ~~appreciable~~ and unless I were fully acquainted with the extent of your illness, I should not be able to prescribe in such a way as to bring about any improvement. However I do not believe there are any specific remedies, and in my opinion you would receive much more beneficial treatment than I could give you by correspondence if you would consult a good physician, and have him prescribe general measures of treatment. However, if you wish to provide me with details of your illness, perhaps I can give you a more intelligent opinion than I have offered herewith.
