Dear Charlie:

Thanks very much for your recent letters dated November 6 and 8, respectively.

With reference to the Spanish translation to which you refer, you can, of course, use your own judgment in the matter of reprinting additional copies. On the other hand, I have a limited supply of the booklets in question and I shall be glad to send you about half of them under separate cover. This I think will last you some time, and when they are nearly gone, you can proceed to have others printed. I would suggest at that time that you have one hundred printed and that you send half of them to me. However, as I indicated above, I think this will be unnecessary for some time, unless you wish to proceed now.

I have looked over the reports on medical examinations in Aruba and I think we can well leave the men in question to the judgment of Dr. Carrell. In this connection I think in some areas we might find some difficulty in obtaining personnel within the proper category if we were to insist upon the exclusion of persons with a positive Wasserman reaction.

It is good to hear from you again for any reason and it would be a pleasure to see and talk with you. By the time you receive this we will probably be approaching the Christmas season, and therefore I take this opportunity to express to you and your family our very best wishes for a happy Christmas.
