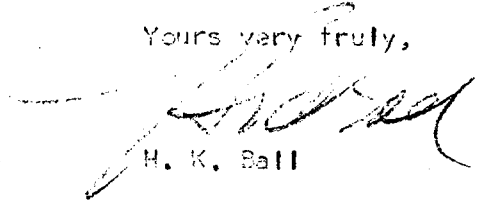

Mr. peppers received the news of the increase in octane number for Ethyl quite calmly. He did say it would hurt them a lot, since they will not be able to make as much Ethyl at the new octane number as they have been at the present level. He would very much like to be able to raise the TEL Content to 3.5 cc/gal. and it is quite sincere in his feelings. He says that we allow 1.6 in aviation fuel, why not 3.5 in motor fuel? With extra half cc/gallon he feels that there are many smaller companies who would be able to meet 90 without much trouble. He would like to have an expression from New York on this request.

Mr. Guinn tells me they are selling 11.5% of their gasoline as Ethyl. If they have to go to 90 this figure may fall somewhat.

However, Mr. Beebe tells ME they are experimenting with their Perco unit, planning to run heavier base stocks through it, and hope in this way to reach 90 without any drop in quantity. He tells me that this has already been done on similar equipment at a refinery in Texas, and has figures to back up his contention. Discussed DB-36 with above men. Separate report made.
