~~THE PRESENT PROGRAM OF THE AMBLER PIPE PLANT~~

1. Have a chest X-Ray taken on every new male and female employee (including temporary summer help), and if the Plant Doctor and Radiologist determine there is any abnormalities we do not hire them.
2. All employees (male and female, hourly and salaried) have a chest X-Ray taken as part of the required annual "physical". Any abnormalities or changes from previous X-Rays are made known to the employee's personal physician, including copies of the X-Rays if that physician requests them.
3. Any changes in the chest X-Rays of lungs which indicate a potential problem are brought to my attention by a letter from the Plant Doctor who at that time may recommend a job change. In all cases the recommendation is followed without question.

The X-Rays are taken by Dr. D. S. Bantley located in the Maple Glen Medical Center where our Plant Doctor (Dr. D. J. Donald) also has his offices. Dr. Bantley is a fully qualified and actively practising Radiologist with the latest equipment. He personally "reads" all X-Rays taken as part of the pre-employment or regular annual "physical" given as noted above and reports his findings to Dr. Donald.

The Travelers Insurance Company wants to be assured that 14" x 17" chest X-rays are obtained at pre-employment physical examinations and at least two-year intervals thereafter. They want these X-rays interpreted by a competent radiologist and want you to act on the results of these interpretations.

New employees found to have potential lung problems at the pre-employment examinations should be screened out.

Regular employees found to have beginning lung complications at the biennial check-ups should be moved to jobs with reduced exposure.

We are exploring the possibility of having a centrally controlled program wherein all X-rays would be interpreted by the same radiologist. This would also provide for a uniform method of informing employees of the results without alarming them.

Please advise me as to your present practice insofar as X-rays are concerned. We must be assured that X-rays are being obtained for new employees and biennially for all employees.
