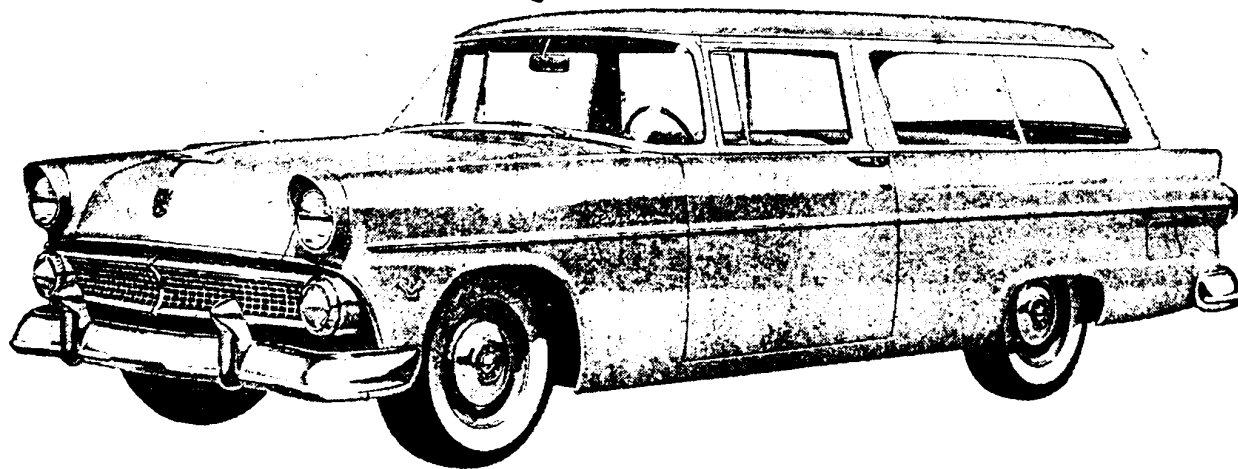

Home subscribers to the paper will receive a clue in the "dividend clue" in the classified section. The early editions following day will repeat the "dividend clue."

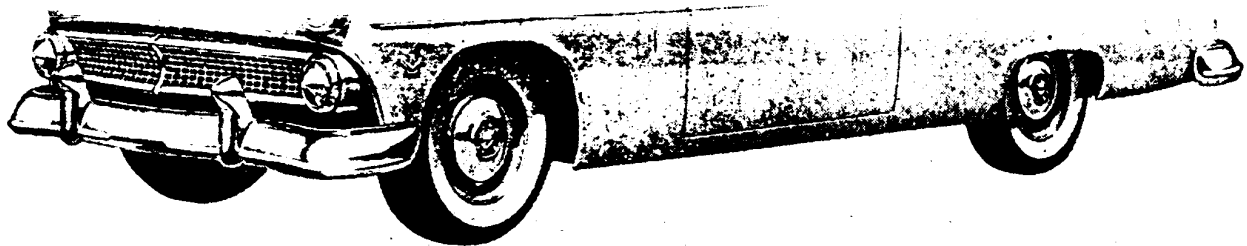

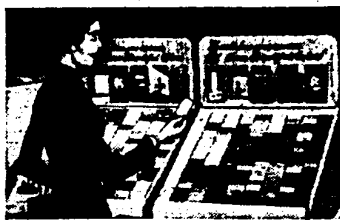

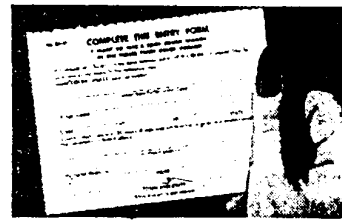

Wife-Strangler Declared Insane

John Servanti, 42, a man who shot his wife to death March 21, after a Burlingame home was declared insane yesterday, committed to the Alameda State Hospital.

The commitment was by Superior Judge L. Dematteis in Redwood after a review of psychiatric reports submitted by Dr. P. Quimbach and Dr. Levy.

The Judge said the indicated Servanti was suffering from a mental condition that would not allow him to participate in his own defense. If he recovers his sanity he will be returned for trial.
