NAPLES, Fla. – Today, Governor Rick Scott urged families in South Florida to monitor the weather system in the Caribbean Sea and stay alert for potential flooding and heavy rain this weekend. The Governor received a weather briefing from the Florida Division of Emergency Management and the state will continue to monitor any potential impacts.
