I must apologize for my long delay in replying to your letter -- as you suggested, I have been busy, but make that no excuse.

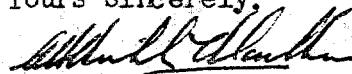
On your advice. I have done nothing further concerning my manuscript, but hope to discuss it, and other matters, with you when I come out to Cincinnati later in the year.
