My dear Mr. Ecker:

Our medical people have asked me to write you about a matter in which they are vitally concerned and which has to do with the services of your Doctor Lanza.

To put it briefly, the story is that in the program of our new medical center we are going in heavily for certain types of work in industrial medicine and that a country-wide search by our medical people for somebody to head up the work means that they have come back to Doctor Lanza as the most competent man in sight and the man they want for that purpose. They have talked with him and he is willing, if the details can be worked out with you; hence this letter to you directly about it.

They feel of course that it would be preferable to have him on a full time basis if that could be arranged. But failing that, at least on a basis which would mean that he would give a part of his time to us and a part to you. They tell me that he is actively interested in helping us get the work set up and going and we should of course like to have his services on either of the above bases become available as soon as possible.

I know what an important member of your staff Doctor Lanza is and it is only my urgent sense of the importance of our own development at this time which leads me to ask you to do us this great favor. I am hopeful that you and Doctor Lanza together may be able to work out something about it. In case you have any questions about this, may I come to see you?
