How is life in the US today? It is dark and time to go home in Beijing.

Malcolm Brinded is in Shanghai on June 11 and meeting the Shanghai Mayor. I need to

prepare briefing material giving the background and latest of this project. I can cobble something together from previous material and add this latest information in your last note.

Is there a more recent update, or indeed an updated project document that I should use to ensure I have the latest information? (I can't access the website which appears to require a name and password? I probably need to access it)

I do not expect that this project will be a topic for conversation with the mayor - Malcolm as plenty to discuss on developing our business there (and I expect will cover EMBARQ Shanghai transportation).

As far as I am aware there are no issues that would require a high level discussion with the mayor - he just needs the background in case it does come up and might just acknowledge it is passing as an example of our support for Shanghai.

In the meantime, below is a brief version of the recent progress/ milestones since the opening ceremony:

- To date, 26 hospitals in Shanghai have forwarded cases to the lab; including the second most prominent hospital in Shanghai (a rival of Fudan)
- Over 100 NHL/AML cases have been identified; patients are offered to the opportunity to become part of study; case identification is on target with plan
- Key milestone for this year will be the second annual meeting will be in August in Monterrey, California
- In 2005, the annual meeting will be in Shanghai
- Shell is now chairing the Oversight and Budget committees

- There is a vacancy on the ethics review panel which will be filled; Dr. Brody had to resign due to health problems
- Recommendations from the ethics and scientific review panel presented at the first annual meeting have yet to be incorporated into the protocols due to lengthy review process
 - These changes include adding a urine analysis and HIV test
 - The urine analysis was recommended because without it, there are no comparable data points to utilize when reviewing this study and others (e.g. NIH study)
 - The HIV test was recommended because of the virus' impact on the immune system and determining how it is a factor
- Discussing and developing the engagement plan for the technical and oversight committee

With respect to the Shell Report, I confirmed that we have not included a section on this study. In addition, Barnaby suggested that perhaps it would be more appropriate to include in the Shell China report next year.

During a brief discussion with Patsy Clegg, I noted that Malcolm will be attending the Shanghai Mayor's business council meeting in October; she asked whether we might want to further explore how to leverage the opportunity vis a vis this study. Please advise on this.

I told Patsy that we would like the consortium to ask for Irons' outreach program and discuss further.

Hope this is helpful. Will follow up with the revised communications strategy in the coming days.
