Dear Dr. Winslow:

I was in Des Moines, Iowa, yesterday when your letter of March 28 arrived. I attended a meeting on Wednesday of this week at the Union League Club of a number of representatives of the six foundry associations interested in the "Committee Report on Health Protection in Sand Blasting and Metallic Abrasive Cleaning." The latest information is as follows:

- 1 - The six associations have appointed their presidents, or other executive officer, as members of a Steering Committee.
- 2 - The Steering Committee has appointed a Reviewing Committee composed of:

Mr. Jones of Racine, Wisconsin  
Mr. Elam of the American Steel Foundries  
Dr. Chivers of the Crane Company, Chicago  
Mr. C. E. Hoyt as a fourth member to  
head up the Committee and see that it  
acts efficiently.

Mr. Hoyt, after these arrangements were made, got in touch with Mr. McClandish and told him that his Committee would be glad to receive any objections they had to the Technical Report, and for consideration by the Reviewing Committee. However, the sand people will be kept out of the Reviewing Committee in any official capacity.
