MAGNESIUM PILOT PLANT OPERATING

For the past six weeks, the Magnesium Reduction Co., National Lead Company's new subsidiary, has had a pilot plant in full operation at Luckey, Ohio. The unit, which is similar in essential details to the main plant now under construction, was started up on Oct. 9, less than 4 months after ground for the latter was broken.

ATLANTIC BRANCH SALESMAN DIES

Guy Hunter, Atlantic branch salesman covering Northern and Central New York State, died in Scranton, Pa., on Nov. 21 after a brief illness. He was 57. His home was in Utica, N.Y.

Mr. Hunter, who had been a painting contractor in Rochester, N.Y., prior to joining National Lead Company in 1937, was long active in trade association circles. He was for many years secretary of the New York State Master Painters' Association and, at the time of his death, was president of the Utica Paint & Allied Trade Salesmen's Club.

Mr. Hunter is survived by his widow, Cora M. Hunter, and a daughter, Mrs. Evelyn White.
