Dear Mr. Yates:

Re: Chicle Investigation Report.

1. Yesterday Mr. Buck telephoned that the Wm. Wrigley Jr. Co. approves my suggested report to the United States Department of Agriculture subject to two incidental changes. They are: (1) eliminate the last two sentences of Paragraph No. 7; and (2) eliminate Clause (c) of Paragraph No. 12. The first change is for accuracy; the second is to strengthen the latter paragraph. I agreed to make these two changes. And I was highly gratified by Mr. Buck's complimentary remarks upon this report.

2. Mr. Ellithorp writes as follows: "We have carefully read the communication you expect to send to the U. S. Department of Agriculture and approve this report for immediate transmission to Mr. Campbell."

3. Mr. W. C. Arkell returns my letter enclosing this report with the following comment: "The attached looks O.K. to W. C. Arkell."

4. Mr. P. L. Becker writes you as follows: "The proposed report to the United States Department of Agriculture, a copy of which was attached to Mr. Dunn's letter of July 21st, is in my opinion very good and meets with my approval. I wish to suggest one minor change. On Page 3, Section IV, Paragraph 2, the following phrase appears: '...and because they contain solder for riveting purposes...'. The people in Washington might not understand why anyone would use solder for riveting purposes. Therefore, I suggest this be changed to - '...and because they contain solder which was used to seal riveted seams...'. This suggested change will be made."

Therefore and because all 3 manufacturers have now approved this report, so changed, I am transmitting it

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to Messrs. Campbell and Wharton accordingly. I enclose a copy of this rewritten report for your file and I am sending a similar copy to each of the three manufacturers.
