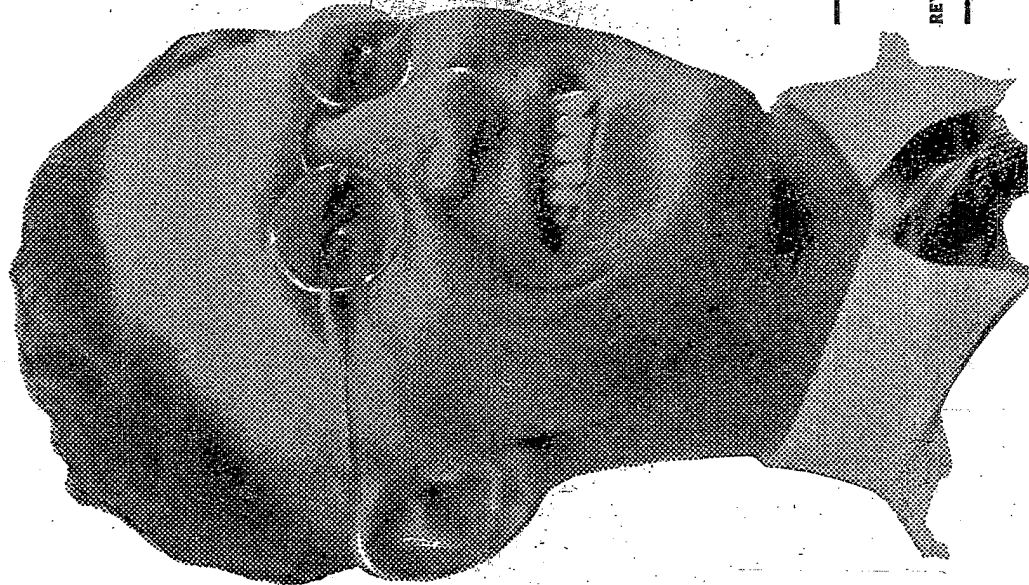


1931 GRAND AMERICAN HANDICAP



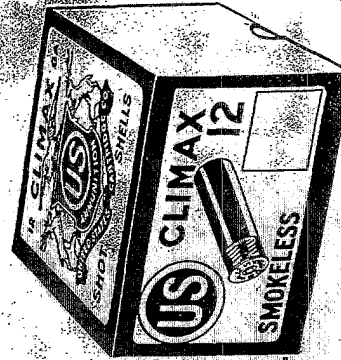
3 out of first 5 shot U. S. Shells

The 1931 Grand American Handicap was a U. S. Ammunition event. Not only did the winner, Rev. Garrison Roebuck, McClure, Ohio, use U. S. Traploads, but 4th, 5th and 8th places also went to shooters of U. S. Clipse and Defiance shells as follows: 4th—Frank Foltz, McClure, Ohio; 5th—S. J. Chadley, Desplaines, Ill.; 8th—Dr. L. Finney, Georgetown, Ill. In addition, Mrs. W. Stillwagon, Trenton, N. J., shooting Defiance finished second among the ladies in the Grand American.

Other events at Vandalia in which U. S. shooters scored were:

Veteran Championship (for shooters over 70 years of age), won by F. D. Kelley of East Aurora, Ill., shooting Clipse Traploads. 182.200
Sub Junior Championship of North America won by Joe Finel (11 years) of Dubuque, Iowa, shooting Defiance Traploads. 87.100
Class B Third Trophy won by J. E. Bond of Chicago, shooting Defiance Traploads. 164.200
Ladies' Championship of North America tied for first place, Mrs. H. E. Giesby of Oklahoma City, shooting Defiance Traploads. 101.200
Ladies' Race, Preliminary Handicap, tied for second trophy, Mrs. W. F. Stanton of Oklahoma City, shooting Defiance Traploads. 84.100
