- Ex 3 5/27/63 J.M. letter re sales of blue or chrys. A.
- Ex 4 Fosco 1/23/64 internal memo on equal quality of White A for Blue in Profax
- Ex 6 4/7/64 NAAC → Fosco passes on 4/3/64 letter from R Gaze at Cape suggesting that Fosco convert to amosite, discussing concerns at LCa and Meso.
- Ex 7 4/65 report describes silica and asbestos free Profax mineral wool gave superior results, chopped fiberglass very much more expensive than A.
- Ex 8 Silicosis and Asis Hazards Assoc. w/ Mfg. + Use of Profax
8/10/65 Confidential Fosco Rpt. (R+B)
- customer inquiries re Profax health hazards incl. concerns at Asis + LCa
 - croc + amos. most dangerous chry. slightly less harmful
 - best solution to repl. A + silica w/ non toxic matls
 - Fosco Int'l recommends changing amosite for croc. in Profax
 - respirators are least satisfactory protection of men from toxic dusts
 - local dust extraction best for cutting or grinding Profax but costly for steelworks
 - regular air sampling + periodic med. exams may be necessary
 - contain. of work a bad danger, regular changes should be provided

- dust extraction & supplied air respirators needed where cutting, grinding & filing in Profax mfg.
- only long term solution is to supply Profax made of non toxic materials
- chopped glass fiber a suitable substitute for A but very expensive
- problems w/ slag wool under investigation as this is cheaper than A

- S'sis & A'sis "recognized by Fosco as the major disadvantages of Profax since its inception."
