- disc* ~~1. P~~ a development of chemical and spectrographic methods for the determination of small quantities of lead in biological material.
- ~~2. P~~ Establishment of existence *general pattern* and magnitude of normal lead *metabolism* in both primitive and civilized man, ~~together with some indication of the sources of this lead.~~
- Characteristics and the* ~~3. P~~ The behavior of tetraethyl lead in the human organism, *together with the clinical treatment of lead intoxication produced by concentrated tetraethyl lead.*
- ~~4. P~~ The lead hazards associated with the manufacture and blending of tetraethyl lead with gasoline and regulations necessary for safe handling of this material.
- ~~5. P~~ Studies of leaded gasoline the results of which indicate that no likelihood of public health hazard exists from the distribution of this substance as a motor fuel."

I am merely thinking that it will be difficult for anyone not a specialist to find in the existing volume any brief summary of the conclu-

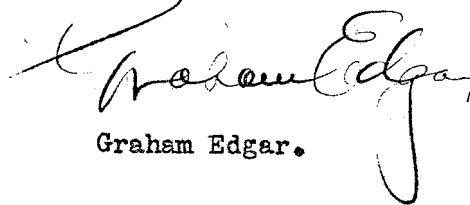
