Dear Mr. Kehoe:

The Delaware Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics with the assistance of a contract from the United States Public Health Service is sponsoring the Eastern Regional Conference on Childhood Lead Poisoning on June second and third. One of the topics for discussion will be lead intake from food and the atmosphere. With this background the Executive Committee of the Delaware Chapter has asked that I contact you to ascertain your interest in delivering a paper on lead intake from food and the atmosphere to an audience of approximately 300 interested physicians and paramedical personnel at the Conference on June 2. Approximately 15 minutes could be allowed on the program so that you might deliver a paper and approximately 7 to 10 minutes available for answering questions.
