BFG was offered about 40 million pounds of monomer from Robintech on the schedule previously stated by Mr. Sommerman on the basis that we would convert part of this monomer at least into resin to be sold to a Robintech customer such as Johns Mannville. Robintech apparently is no longer very interested in an exchange arrangement whereby this monomer could be exported, but no price was mentioned for the monomer retained by BFG. It was stated that BFG would have to have some monomer for its own use and that BFG had planned commitments to other concerns for at least part of any monomer conversion capacity that became available.

~~In the long term Mr. Corbett does not see Robintech or Shintech competing with BFG in the resin market. He stated that they envisioned themselves as fabricating companies and that they are dedicated and committed to the pipe market.~~

Robintech wants to have a polymer plant on the West Coast for this lucrative market and it would be based on potential VCM that may become available from Dow at Pittsburg, California (this was the first time the writer had heard of building a VCM plant at that location).
