General medical history and specific questioning
with regard to illness, occupational or otherwise, give no
evidence of ill-health.

Physical examination was likewise negative.

Laboratory data (urinalysis, blood examinations,
and chest x-ray) were normal except for the following items:

1. The white blood count was somewhat elevated. This
was probably due to a common cold at the time of the examination.
2. The amount of lead in the urine and in the blood
was somewhat increased above the normal.

Conclusions and Recommendations

This man is in good health and the amounts of lead
found in his urine and blood are not dangerously high. However
he should be more careful of the amount of lead dust which he
breathes, especially while working in the confines of boxcars.
We suggest that a mask be worn whenever the dust is heavy.
