Patsy,

Happy to discuss with you.

We did know something about this but were disappointed not to be included in the decision-making process as clearly this project has reputation implications that may impact or be linked to our other operations in China, in particular other high profile projects such as the West-East Pipeline Project. Our only input was to question the advisability of such a study more than a year ago when we heard about it through Barnaby. We have had no further involvement.

In the meantime, can you urgently, can you supply us with a public (media) position on this project and questions and answers so we can make sure we are ready for media inquiries given that there is clearly opportunity for media to misunderstand the rationale and benefits of the survey. We have several projects now in the media spotlight covering very sensitive issues and this may well be linked to them. We need to be prepared.

Can you also urgently advise plans for publicising the study, and tell us of any information that is already in the public domain?
