MEASUREMENT OF FIBER CONCENTRATIONS IN AIR

It has been difficult for us to try to put together for you all that we feel you would need to make the determinations of asbestos fiber concentrations in air in work places.

Since we last talked about it, Haskell Laboratory has been asked to conduct dust and fiber concentration studies at two plant sites. We are putting together all of the equipment for these surveys. I want to ask if you and your management would be agreeable to let our industrial hygiene engineer visit your plant, make the evaluations of fiber concentrations in air, and work with one or more of your people so that follow-up studies, if needed, could be made by you all.

The technical hours required for our participation would amount to about 12 - 14 at \$20.00 each. We would ask that your department bear our cost of travel; also, out-of-pocket expenses for material and fiber-counting services (about \$240).
