INSURANCE - Western and Vampire Corros. We note you paid premiums (including Stamp Duty) of £9.17.0. and £92.1.6. on Policy Nos 12/66028 and 12/66029, covering the above holdings respectively. These policies were in the name of the Colonial Sugar Refining Co. Ltd.

We refer to Head Office letter No. 451 of the 30th January, 1948, in which Head Office set out the procedure to be adopted covering Stores, Buildings, Equipment etc. on these leases.

As C.S.R. Co. Hired Plant items are the only ones to which C.S.R. Co. retain the title, and these normally being covered for insurance by you, C.S.R. Co. allowed their policies to lapse. The United Insurance have apparently rendered you an account in error covering these policies and it would appear that the schedule of items covered may need revising.

As the above-mentioned policies had been cancelled by C.S.R. Co. it would also appear that the United Insurance Co. will need to issue you with new policies.

Would you please advise so that the matter may be finalised.
