OECD Survey on Hazard and Fate Assessments of PFAS conducted by National Authorities or International Organisations

As part of the work on PFAS at the OECD, it was agreed to survey countries to identify where hazard or fate assessments for PFAS have been conducted by national authorities or intergovernmental organisations. This will help to inform assessment or management of PFAS in different countries, identify collaboration opportunities and ideally reduce duplication of activities. It could also aid in understanding of grouping approaches to PFAS that have been used in assessment.

This survey is being carried out under both the Working Party on Hazard Assessment (WHPA) and the OECD/UNEP Global PFC Group (now under the provision of the new Working Party on Risk Management).

Note to the WPHA: This survey is complementary to the information collection that took

place on national activities for grouping of PFAS that has been carried out in the context of the WPHA. Although some overlapping elements are included in the survey in regards to grouping, this is with the aim to also further understand where grouping approaches have already been used for assessment purposes.

Please carefully read the instructions for the survey in the first tab of the spreadsheet, then complete the second tab containing a table high level information regarding hazard or fate assessments of PFAS.
