

Excerpt from letter to Dr. Clarence Selby, August 12, 1944:

If it seems desirable that the four organizations should continue to meet at one time and place, I would like to suggest that the times and places of meetings be decided upon by a committee established for that express purpose and representing all four organizations, that committee being empowered to tell Mr. Hales and his associates where, how and when we are to meet, rather than accepting a decision from him or anyone unconcerned with the technical and scientific interests of the several organizations.

Excerpt from Dr. Selby's reply, August 14, 1944:

You have made a suggestion that I believe should be followed up; namely, that the times and places of meetings should be decided by a committee established for that expressed purpose and representing all four organizations, that committee be empowered to take action.
