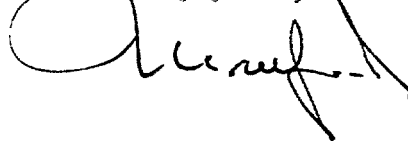
Some time ago, you were kind enough to send me a copy of your report, "The Occurrence and Significance of Lead in the Paint Used on Toys."
