Mr. [REDACTED], a chemical engineer employed by the Frigidaire Corporation of this city, is coming to see you within the next day or two.

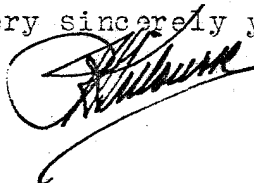
Mr. [REDACTED] has been under our observation since August 13, 1932, and according to our opinion he is suffering from some allergic reaction with his upper respiratory tract as the shock organ. Our treatment has been symptomatic using cocaine and ephedrine in an effort to shrink down the nasal mucous membranes. We have also used the Proetz displacement treatment, obtaining a considerable amount of pus, which we believe came from the posterior ethmoid and sphenoid. We also washed his left maxillary sinus by means of puncture through the inferior meatus obtaining some shreddy mucus in return.

He will no doubt give you a history as regards his contacts and the suspected substance to which he is sensitive.

Mr. [REDACTED] is a very interesting case and I should very much appreciate your sending me a report of your findings.
