SUBJECT: HR 7447-LIFO

On April 25, at the direction of the board of directors of the Lead Industries Association, we sent you a copy of HR 7447 concerned with cost or market inventory pricing for LIFO users, together with some explanatory comments. No member of the Association has expressed opposition to this legislation and a number have expressed a keen desire for its passage.

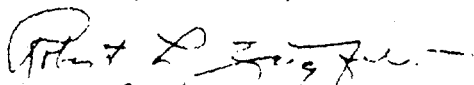
We are now enclosing a reprint from the May 5 issue of STEEL, which explains the purpose of the legislation clearly and concisely. The bill is now in the hands of the Ways and Means Committee of the House of Representatives and even though Congress may adjourn early, since this is an election year, it may receive consideration at this session, if there is sufficient demand for it and if it does not appear particularly controversial.
