general tightening of wartime restrictions, British colonial authorities were empowered today to forbid the entry into or departure from Hongkong of ships and aircraft of any nationality and use force to enforce the order.

Other steps announced today provide more stringent censorship of press and communications, a ban on association or communication with any person who may "even be believed to be engaged in assisting the enemy," and heavy penalties for sabotage, which is defined to include the impeding or impairing of any essential public service.
