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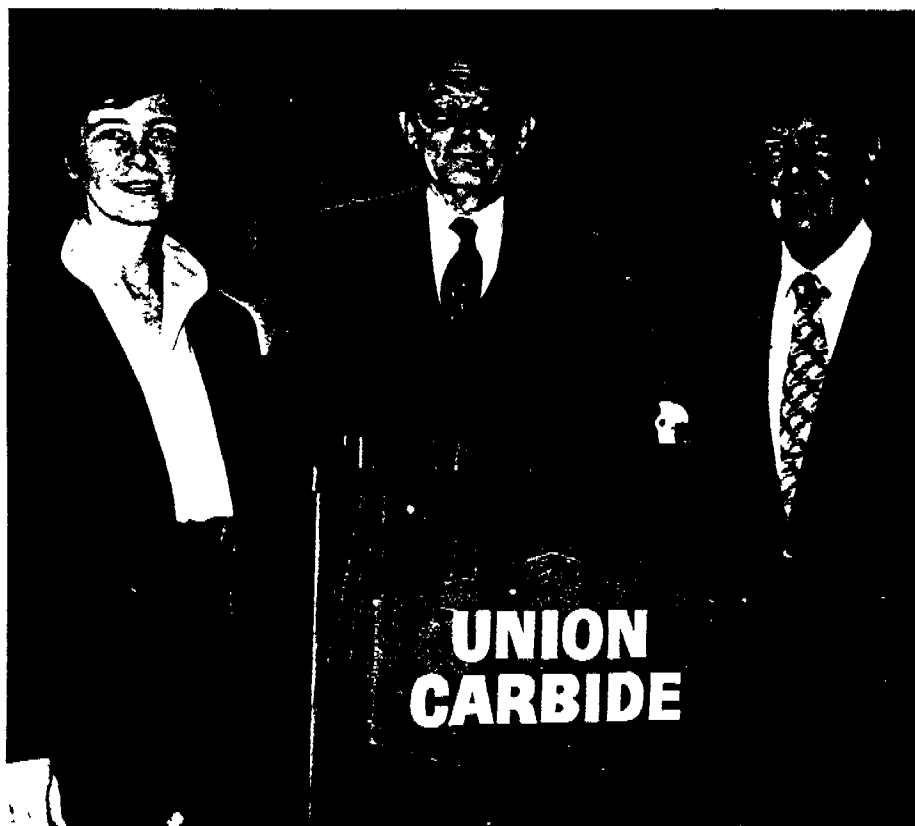

UNION CARBIDE TEXAS CITY PLANT HOSTS PRESS



Last Wednesday morning, November 11, Union Carbide's Texas City Plant hosted members of the "Fourth Estate" for a press briefing where Plant Manager DAMON ENGLE, Gulf Coast Medical Director Dr. DAVID GLENN, and Corporate Epidemiologist Dr. SUSAN AUSTIN, shared the results of Union Carbide's Mortality Study and Case Control Study which have now been completed. "Studies which indicate that Union Carbide employees at

Texas City have enjoyed better than average health. The overall incidence of death has been significantly less than the national average as have been deaths due to all forms of malignant cancer and circulatory, respiratory, and digestive diseases," Engle informed the visitors.

Minority Luncheon and Tour

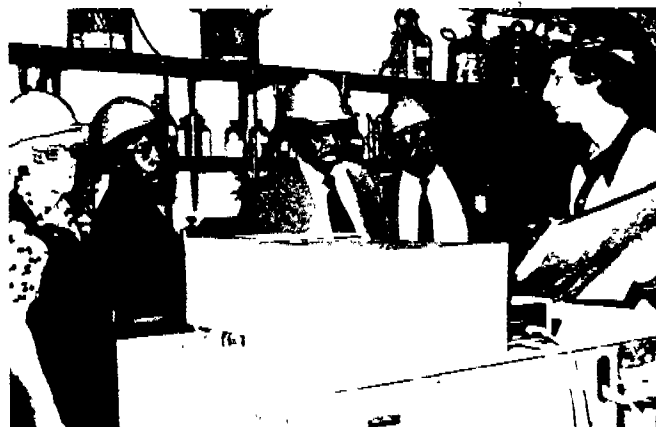

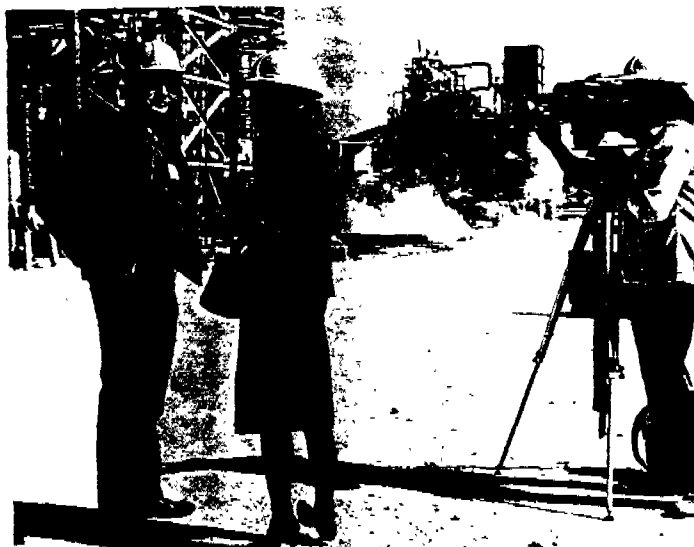

TEXAS CITY— Officials of Union Carbide said Wednesday there is no correlation between brain cancer deaths and employee exposure to chemicals used or manufactured at its Texas City plant.

"We believe the present safety standards and health practices here in the plant protect our employees from any known health hazards.

"If we should discover or learn of any health hazard in the future, we'll take whatever precautions we need to take immediately," plant manager Damon L. Engle said at a press conference revealing the results of the two-year Carbide study of brain cancer.

Engle stated unions at Carbide were an important part of the communications process concerning the study. Plant management have met with union officials on several occasions to discuss the study and union representatives has met separately with NIOSH and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).

An abnormal number of brain cancer deaths at the Union Carbide plant in Texas City appears to be a "chance occurrence" not related to chemical exposure at the plant, company officials said Wednesday.

They gave that opinion in announcing the results of a two-year epidemiology study of 6,588 present or past employees of the plant since its startup in 1941.

Plant manager Damon L. Engle said the study turned up 12 confirmed deaths from primary brain cancer. Based on the brain cancer death rate in the general population, he said, there should have been 7.42 deaths at Union Carbide.

BUT NO CORRELATION could be found between the brain cancer cases and any chemical ever used or manufactured at the Texas City plant, Engle said.

Similar clusters of brain cancer deaths have been found at other chemical plants around the nation, including Dow at Freeport and Monsanto at Texas City. No link to chemical exposure has been established at those plants either.

Engle said Union Carbide's 2,400 workers were notified by letter Monday of the study findings. The letter assured the workers the Texas City plant provides "more than adequate protection from known health hazards."

Union Carbide and the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health began parallel studies of the brain cancer deaths in February 1979.

The NIOSH study results, completed but still under review, are expected to be released in a month or so.

ENGLE SAID BOTH studies drew on the same medical and death records and employed the same statistical ground rules, so the results should match pretty closely.

Some NIOSH scientists, however, were reported to have questions about some of Union Carbide's interpretations of its data, particularly in ruling out chemical exposure as the possible cause of the brain cancers.

The NIOSH scientists earlier had speculated that the culprit might be vinyl chloride, a chemical known to cause a rare form of liver cancer. But no solid evidence has turned up to support this theory.

TEXAS CITY — An exhaustive two-year in-house study revealed there is no correlation between brain cancer and Union Carbide employee exposure to chemicals, Carbide officials said Wednesday.

In a press conference to detail the refinery's findings, Union Carbide plant manager Damon Engle said results of the study indicate that "present safety standards protect our employees."

More than 2,400 Union Carbide employees have been awaiting the findings since an employee asked the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) to investigate a possible link between brain cancer and chemicals manufactured at the Texas City plant.

Initial findings had indicated to National Institute

for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) researchers that workers at Union Carbide face twice the risk of contracting brain cancer as members of the general population.

Following that 1979 report, NIOSH and Union Carbide undertook a more complex study of brain cancer and employee deaths.

The two companies, working separately, investigated the deaths of all white men employed at the refinery from 1941 to 1979.

The study revealed the overall mortality rate of Carbide employees is less than the national average, Engle said. There were 765 deaths among 6,588 employees during that period.

TEXAS CITY — Although brain cancer deaths among workers at the Union Carbide plant here exceed the national average, the company says the deaths are not job-related.

Results released Wednesday of a 20-month study by Union Carbide indicate that the number of those workers who died of brain cancer is higher than what would be expected.

The company said brain cancer caused the deaths of 12 employees from 1941, when the plant began operations, to Dec. 31, 1977. The company said 765 plant workers and former workers died during that same period. Comparing the data to national rates, the company said that 7.42 deaths due to brain cancer would be expected. The deaths occurred among 6,588 plant employees.

Although the study covered 12 brain cancer deaths, Union Carbide officials said that actually 20 employees with brain tumors have died to date. The study was limited to white males who died before or during 1977. The other eight deaths included four black males, and four workers who died after Dec. 31, 1977. Another Union Carbide employee was diagnosed three months ago as having brain cancer and is still living. Officials said these were not included for statistical reasons.

Both Union Carbide and the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health Administration began separate studies in March 1979 to determine whether a correlation existed between brain cancer deaths and exposure to chemicals used at the Texas City plant.

The company and the federal agency used the same data in their studies. Results of the NIOSH study, however, have not been released.

The federal agency earlier this year, while in the midst of its study, said brain cancer deaths at Union Carbide appeared to be excessively high and job-related.

Damon Engle, plant manager at Union Carbide, said results of the government study are expected soon.

Engle and Dr. David Glenn, plant physician, attributed the higher brain cancer rate at Union Carbide's Texas City plant to chance, not to chemical exposure at the plant.
