Appropos of your memo of the above date on New Jersey lithopons, we should perhaps tell you that we have ordered 50# bags of the several grades of Albalith which we feel we may be doing the most work on for countermatch purposes. These grades are Albalith 13, 73, 90, 332 and 362. In line with your suggestion about obtaining the characteristics of the various grades, this work is already under way.

Incidentally, we have attached the section on countermatches for Permalith which appears in the present Permalith brochure. This lists our current nearest countermatches for the various grades of Albalith.

One additional grade of lithopone which we have run into, but which New Jersey never indicated in their sales bulletins or the Pigment Index, is Albalith 90. This appears to be an extra high consistency, low-reactivity lithopone. Apparently this is only supplied to special customers and is not carried as a regular grade.

We have just received a 5 lb. sample of Albalith 73. A portion of this has been submitted to Herb Schwarz together with our Permalith 60-J, as well as a sample of Permalith 40-M, for comparative evaluation. Characteristics on other grades will be established as the material is received and we will pass the information along as it accumulates.
