Medical and Engineering Transactions Issued

The Transactions covering the Medical and Engineering Section of the Foundation's Tenth Annual Meeting were published and sent to members recently. This notable publication contains:

A preliminary report by Dr. C.O. Sappington on a field study now in progress on Industrial Health Department Functions;

A panel discussion on Accurate Diagnosis of Silicosis, led by Dr. Leroy U. Gardner;

A report on Accurate Measurement of Silicosis Hazards by Dr. F.R. Holden and other members of the Foundation's staff, and

A detailed report by Dr. W.M. Gafafer on the continuing study of sick absenteeism in which the Foundation has been cooperating with the U.S. Public Health Service since 1940.

Use of Aluminum in Combating Silicosis

The Council on Industrial Health and the Council on Pharmacy and Chemistry of the American Medical Association have issued a report on "Aluminum in the Prevention and Treatment of Silicosis". This is published in the April 27 issue of the "Journal of the American Medical Association". A copy of the report is contained in the current INDUSTRIAL HYGIENE DIGEST.

Dr. Walmer Named Foundation Medical Director

Announcement is made of the appointment of Dr. C. Richard Walmer as Medical Director of Industrial Hygiene Foundation.

Dr. Walmer took up his duties as full-time physician for the Foundation on August 1. He will direct the medical phases of the organization's efforts for the improvement of working conditions and the advancement of employee health. He will also serve as Secretary of the Foundation's Medical Committee which is headed by Dr. A.J. Lanza, Associate Medical Director, Metropolitan Life Insurance Company.

For the past five years Dr. Walmer has been associated with Dr. T. Lyle Hazlett, Medical Director at Westinghouse Electric Corporation, serving as toxicologist and as a consulting specialist in industrial medicine. He has had wide experience with sick disability cases and in protecting workers against health hazards. He is a staff member of Presbyterian and Braddock General Hospitals, Pittsburgh.

Upon graduation from Washington and Jefferson College, Dr. Walmer entered the University of Pittsburgh Medical School where he obtained his M.D. degree in 1934. After interning at Pittsburgh Hospital, he took one year of postgraduate work in medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. Besides his medical training, Dr. Walmer also holds the Master of Science degree in chemistry.
