FIVE DIE IN MILITARY SERVICE

Word has been received of the recent deaths of five former Company employees in military service. They are: Pvt. Alfred P. Allison, Jr., U.S. Army, from John T. Lewis & Bros. Co.; Pvt. Herman L. Draskiewicz, USMC, from the Depew plant of the Magnesium Metal Division; Pvt. Joseph L. Sulczynski, U.S. Army, from the Bradley plant of the Atlantic branch; and Privts. Stanley F. Figura and John J. Kish, U.S. Army, from the Sayreville plant of the Titanium Division. Their deaths increase the number of gold stars on the Company's service flag to 17.

Pvt. Allison, 19 years old, died in France on July 25 from wounds received on the first day of the European invasion, June 6. A corpsman in a medical unit, he had joined the service in 1943. He had been employed in the John T. Lewis & Bros. Co. laboratory since early in 1943.

Pvt. Draskiewicz, 31 years old, was killed on Saipan in the Pacific theatre on June 14. He had left for military service in November, 1942, after two years employment at the Depew plant.

Pvt. Sulczynski, 29, was reported killed in action in the European theatre on July 9. He joined Atlantic's Bradley plant in March, 1936, and soon became an expert Barton pot operator. He entered the service in August, 1943, and embarked for England in March of this year.

Pvt. Figura, 35 years of age, was killed in France during July. He had joined the Titanium Division at Sayreville in December, 1939, and entered military service in May, 1942.

Pvt. Kish, 26, died in this country last May following a throat operation. He had been stationed at a prisoner of war camp in Nebraska. He had been in the service since July, 1941, leaving for service two years after joining the Sayreville plant.
