Re: Mr. G.D. Allan.

Following your letter to me of the 11th April concerning the above named and my conversation with you, I saw Mr. Allan during my recent visit to Perth in the office of the General Superintendent, Australian Film Institute Ltd., St. George's Terrace.

Mr. Allan is aged 45 years, weighs 14 stone, and is a very active person, but he complains of shortness of breath on effort in the last two or three years, mostly on going up stairs and walking up hills. This has become worse gradually, and whilst it is not disabling, it is a constant complaint. There is some heaviness in the front of his chest after effort, but he does not regard this as a definite pain.

Dr. J. McNulty had supplied further clinical notes and the x-rays of chest as requested.

There is no doubt that this man is suffering from some degree of silicosis or possibly arteriosclerosis, but I am not convinced that this condition is giving rise to the present symptoms. For this reason it is necessary for him to be examined by a general physician who has knowledge of the possible legal implications of the silicosis condition. I made arrangements for Mr. Allan to consult Dr. E.A. Hunt of 37 Ord Street, West Perth as being the most helpful physician in this category. I have asked Dr. Hunt to let me have his full report as soon as it is available.

I shall communicate with you again as soon as I hear from Dr. Hunt.
