## CITIZENS TO MEET TONIGHT TO PLAN WATER CAMPAIGN

Will Organize Committee to  
Direct Drive for Votes to  
Put Over Bond Issue.

Citizens of San Diego will assemble in the city council chamber at 7:30 o'clock this evening for the organization of a committee that will direct the campaign in favor of the Sutherland-San Vicente water bonds. The election is to be held Oct. 19, and the amount of the proposed bond issue is \$2,000,000. It will be used for construction of a large dam at Sutherland on the San Dieguito system, a diverting dam at San Vicente on the north branch of the San Diego river, and pipe line connections.

Citizens who are volunteering their services in the campaign are doing so because they believe San Diego must not fail to vote the bonds, as additional water must be developed at once for the growing city. In the belief that the city's future is at stake, these citizens will work energetically to get out the vote Oct. 19. They hope to carry the bonds by the biggest favorable vote ever cast at a water bonds election in San Diego. Officers and committees will be appointed at tonight's meeting.

### ALL INVITED

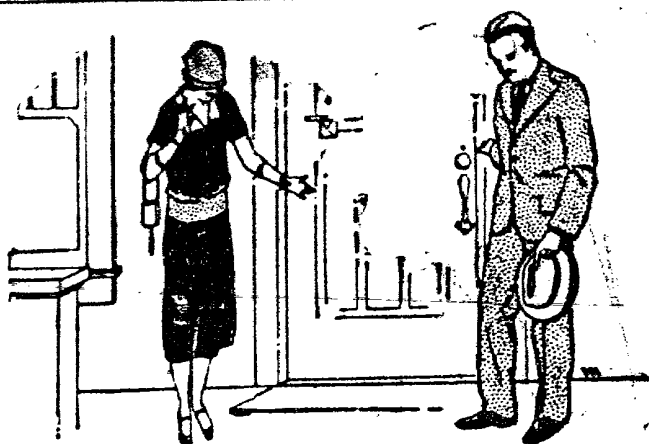
All interested in water development and in the progress of San Diego are invited to this meeting. Those who worked in the El Capitan and San Dieguito campaigns are urged particularly to be present. City Manager Rhodes will be there to answer all questions regarding the project.

As the meeting will start exactly at 7:30, all citizens are urged to be on hand promptly. The council chamber is on the second floor of the city hall.

Members of the Woman's Republican Federation of San Diego County were much interested yesterday in an address made to them by City Manager Fred A. Rhodes, in connection with the Sutherland-San Vicente water development.

The women all are anxious to have San Diego obtain a safe supply of water, and there was a large attendance of the membership at the meeting in the blue room of the T. S. Grant hotel.

Manager Rhodes pointed out that without additional water San Diego will stand still, but that further development, under the present plan, will assure the city a supply to care for future growth.



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
